#### Vicar's Letter

#### Dear Friends and Neighbours,

Happy Birthday! I say this as today is the birthday, in other words the first day of the rest of our lives. I make no apology for mentioning the fact that we are fast approaching another Birthday, it generated the Season of Christmas, and we approach this with some sense of anticipation. Preparations will be one thing, time with friends and family another and the time leading up to this great festival can all become a bit of a roller coaster. Recently, I was in the company of a girl brought up on a farm, who shared with me her childhood memories of going to school with girls whose parents were in the armed forces.

What always made her giggle was the rivalry that existed between the armed forces concerning the sharing of port. 

# The biggest news of the month was that we have got the full £30m funding to deliver the Southern Connector Road:

**SOUTHERN CONNECTOR ROAD – A bypass for Wanborough:** I was delighted that just before the dissolution of Parliament, Robert Buckland and Robert Jenrick (the Secretary of State for Housing) were able to announce that we had got the long awaited funding to deliver this important road which will take traffic from the New Eastern Villages to Commonhead (by-passing Wanborough). You will know that as your local councillor I have been committed to seeing this delivered since I was elected in 2016. It's finally happening and at no cost to Swindon to be completed in 2021.

**LOCAL PLAN REVIEW:** I'm 90% certain at the time of writing this that the final Consultation on the Swindon Local Plan will commence before Christmas for 8 weeks. There remain three sites in Wanborough (Hewers Close, Kite Hill and Ham Road (by the doctors)) and I will share details and encourage a proper discussion about the site consideration and worthwhile comments. Remember this is NOT a planning application but if accepted in the adopted plan this will carry considerable weight. In the last consultation no Parish guidance was provided but I would encourage you to come to my Ward meetings to get practical advice.

**RURAL SUPERFAST BROADBAND:** It is considered essential to how we live, shop, work and play that we have fast and reliable broadband. I'm on the case to deliver options for Wanborough. I have been working on the existing 4G and improvements have been made.

**TREE PLANTING:** We planted over 5000 trees plus 500 wild-flower plugs this year at Manners Wood on Pack Hill on land acquired by Swindon Borough Council as part of the mitigation for the New Eastern Villages. We did this with The Woodland Trust & Nationwide Building Society staff plus Wanborough Primary School pupils. At the final of the three plantings we also had some residents join us. Incredibly rewarding and the Woodland Trust are including this in their target to plant a million trees to help offset climate change.

HIGHWAYS: Consultants have now been appointed to design and implement plans to help minimise 'RAT RUNNING' through Wanborough, Liddington, Bishopstone. I will arrange for information to be shared with residents at my December or January Ward meetings.

Following the PTA's AGM in September we are delighted to confirm that we have been able to donate nearly £14,000 to the School. With school budgets increasing stretched every single penny really does make a difference. It does not stop there though and this academic year we would like to raise even more money. In particular the school has requested help to improve the Information Technology equipment. Currently, even with only half of classes using computers, pupils have to share laptops. This slows development of IT skills and makes teaching more challenging than it needs to be. So, we've agreed a goal to raise £5,000 to buy more laptops and iPads for the school. Watch out for more details and how this will support the children's learning over the coming months.

#### Bash Out the Old Boilers and Ring in the New, this Christmas

Some of you may remember a weekend in April 2018, basking in sunshine at the New Calley Arms sampling 20 cask ales and 10 ciders and perrys. Wanborough's first beer and cider festival. Or the second beer festival, earlier this year, which was somewhat colder.

They were fund-raising events for St Andrews Church and the local community. St Andrews was in need of a new boiler & heating system. Both festivals were considered a great success and significantly enabled the Church to raise the remainder of the funds to cover the work.

The Old Boilers, formed back in 2017, were delighted to see the work carried out during November this year. It all started with a new stone roof over the boiler house. Then the existing system was flushed through and drained. There was however nowhere for the water to go, so the boiler house soon became flooded and had to be pumped dry.

The old twin boilers were very heavy and there was no choice but to break them up to remove them. Although the boilers were dated 1996 Heating Engineer "Digger" as he preferred to call himself, compared the network of cast iron pipe-works throughout the church basement, as something similar to, the cast iron pipe network at Lacock Abbey. Consisting of two quite different pressure networks, believed to be of Victorian construction.

Two wall mounted boilers were installed and connected to a heat exchanger in the church to control the temperatures. 
