Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends and Neighbours,

Welcome to April, a month of two halves. The first half brings Lent to its end while the second marks Easter and the beginning of it's season. Spring begins too. For farmers the main priority over Easter and through April will still be calving, which happens until the middle of May. All calves have their ears tagged for identity purposes, and each one will need a passport. Lambing is mostly finished by the end of April, but the lambs are very vulnerable to foxes and crows so the farmer must try and prevent their stock being killed. Female sheep that have finished weaning, will be dosed against worms and dipped in a chemical mix to stop the spread of disease and illness. April sees fertiliser being spread on grazing fields to aid spring growth, which will be cut for hay and silage later in the year. Potato crops are planted, and drilling starts on oil seed rape and vining peas, while cereal crops will be top-dressed and sprayed, usually with fertilisers or pesticides. Depending if the weather is good, azaleas and cherry trees can blossom in April. Spring, especially early spring, can be a quiet time around some parts of the UK for sea fishing, as many of the winter species will have moved away and the summer species have yet to arrive.

Later spring can be seen as a transitional time as many of the species which have migrated away from the UK for the winter will begin to come back. Plaice arrive in many parts of the UK in later spring, and mackerel, sprats, sand eels and garfish may start arriving. Other species such as pollock and wrasse are present throughout the year but spend the colder months in deeper, offshore waters where they are mostly out of range of the shore angler. Once the seas start warming up they will begin to come back into shallower waters and can be targeted by anglers. However, the sea temperature lags behind the air temperature and it can take a sustained period of warm weather to get the sea to heat up. Silver eels can also be caught around estuaries and rivers during this time due to their migration patterns. Some parts of the UK see an upturn in cod fishing as the cod feed to fatten themselves up before setting off for their migration to colder Scandinavian and Nordic waters. So there's a lot of new life beginning to show itself at this time of year. It's what Jesus is all about. And in certain areas there seems to be a coming together of old time religions with new ones.

The common ground is around the point that we are all connected, to each other and to the planet on which we live. Illness is directly linked to stress and so an increased level of kindness will have a far greater impact on an overstretched NHS budget than anything else. Kindness, along with charity and any every other aspect of being fully human begins at home. Not the four walls and the roof. No, the one that is deep within us. Spiteful people are hurt people and for these we pray, turn the other cheek and so on. Massive improvements in health outcomes and indeed radical remission can indeed be achieved by attitude an attitude of gratitude, voluntary work and very importantly quiet meditation. It's in these moments of calm and thankfulness that our own healing can really take off. Drug companies test people with their new drug and other people with something that only looks like the real thing and yet nearly as many people taking the dummy drug can improve. So a lot of good health outcomes are a matter of belief. Jesus came to tell the world that we are all loved, each and everyone of us. Once we realise how much, great things can and do happen. Happy Easter.

It is the long term aim for the Liddington band to be self-supporting, so they are looking for at least another ten recruits to come forward and join them. Wanborough Parish Council

Storyboard and Trail Project

Parish Council are pleased to confirm that the Parish Clerk has successfully gained a grant from Landfill Communities Fund for £5,000 towards the Storyboard and Trail Project.



Parish Council have also agreed to allocate £4,911 from their Community Infrastructure Levy (CiL) payments to this project. This means that, with the recent pledges for sponsorship of information posts, we are now close to gaining enough money to ensure that this project is fully funded.

Progress with the project is going well and Parish Council would like to thank Anita Basevi for the hard work that she has put into this project. Parish Council have submitted an application to SBC Highways in respect of the location of some of the information posts around the village, which will be located within their land (e.g. highway verges). Hopefully we will receive a positive response over the coming weeks in order that the project is not held up.





The aim is to have the trail installed and ready to use by July 2019. To the left are pictures of examples of how the posts and interaction boards will look, taken from Uffington village. The two interaction boards will be located at the starting points for the trail at Hooper's Field and St Andrew's Church. There will be ten information posts located at points around the trail.

His talk gave the Parish Councillors an interesting insight into the last year of Policing in Wiltshire, especially due to the Novichok incident which had involved drafting in Officers from Police forces all over the country. The Parish Councillors were able to raise several issues relating to Liddington, the important one being the speed of the traffic using the B4192. Ward Councillor update from Gary Sumner:

Ward Councillor Surgery - Saturday 13 April, 9-10.30am, Wanborough Village Hall

M4 Junction 15 update: This major £9.4m scheme is being led by Highways England and will commence September 2019 and take c.15 months. It will increase the capacity of the junction and add a dedicated London-bound lane on the A419. During construction some measures will be put in place to deter rat running via Badbury etc towards Liddington and Wanborough.

A419 White Hart Junction: Due to commence later in 2019, this £30m scheme will signalise the junction, add a new direct 'on ramp' to the A419 Northbound and add considerable capacity to the roundabout.

A419 Gable Cross Junction: Another scheme which will be signalised to make access easier and accommodate planned growth of the New Eastern Villages.

Southern Connector Road: We have an application in for additional Government funding - if successful this would fully fund a £30m scheme which would deliver a new single carriageway road from around Lotmead to the Commonhead Roundabout. This is to future proof access arrangements and provide an alternative to travelling via Wanborough to Commonhead.

Problems with the above: I have requested details of interventions during construction to deter 'rat running' to avoid the expected queues. More to follow!

Lotmead: I anticipate an application shortly for some 2600 homes including a 'first phase' of 200 homes with direct access to the Wanborough Road. The previous application was refused at appeal but the promoters 'Ainscough' have been working on what I trust will be an improved scheme. The 2400 would not come forward until they have access to the North/East (A420).

Speeding: Some interesting events and conversations recently. A 90mph police chase via Liddington ended with a 4x4 crashed on the Commonhead roundabout (3 arrested, 2 escaped). It was a miracle no one was killed. Whilst doing Community Speedwatch in Liddington I recorded one driver at 54mph who was so cocky he had to wave – I spoke to the Police and Crime Commissioner appealing for more police support, but in the meantime more volunteers (particularly in Wanborough) would help establish how much of a problem we have. Parish Councils can use their own funds to purchase more advanced speed warning signs and many residents seem keen to see more of these. Let's make this a priority?

SSPG Update



The Swindon South Protection Group continues to campaign to oppose the planning application for a so called "Science Park" off Pack Hill at Inlands Farm. We are using your contributions to our Fighting Fund to engage consultants and specialists to report on the robustness of the proposal and its claims. Specialist reports will be published on our web

-site as they are received; SSPG.org.uk.

What is being revealed is that the promotion of the proposal as a "Science Park" (SP) appears to be in name only suggesting a flattering branding exercise designed to try to over-ride the local plan with a development of substantial scale and mass in a rural location.

The 33,500m² Phase 1 packaging facility - twice the size of the DB Symmetry Warehouse next to Sainsbury's on the A420 - does **NOT** plant the seedling required to grow a "Science Park".

There is no evidence in the documentation that links the substantial Phase 1 facility to any third party hosting University or Science establishment - an overwhelming criteria for a Science park. Phase 2 includes further industrial units totalling 48,000m2 including another huge warehouse. "Association with a packaging warehouse operation or manufacturing plant alone on an isolated site would not qualify as a Science Park".

"To qualify as an SP a site must have on-site specialist management professionals whose role is to work the SP's physical, economic and network assets to develop a culture of innovation and competitiveness for businesses". We cannot identify in the proposal any hosted research facilities, on-site management or funding commitments for venture capitalists that would support a community of business participants - all required to nurture the exchange of ideas and practice on a wide range of engineering, technology, social science or innovative incubation opportunities.

The Masterplanning, Design and Conservation team in SBC have acknowledged that "the proposed scheme would cause irreversible harm to the surrounding designated heritage assets and open countryside".

The number of new jobs (speculated up to 600) in the application is not in keeping with the size of the greenfield land grab proposed for industrialisation in a sensitive rural area - and can so easily be accommodated in SBC's currently identified employment development sites.

Wanborough Playgroup News

Thank you to everyone who supported our Jumble Sale and Pop up Prosecco Night. Both events were extremely successful and have raised vital funds to keep Playgroup running. As a registered charity (1026150) we rely heavily on fundraising.

We have been enjoying having a "Book of the Week". This term we started with "The Tiger who came to Tea" and had great fun acting out the story and learning more about tigers and other wild animals. Our next book was "The Gruffalo" which had our role play area set up with a Den for the Gruffalo to hide. The children enjoyed taking torches and books to read in the den. We also made Gruffalos out of clay as well as finding out more about animals who live in woodlands. At the time of sending this report our book is "A squash and a squeeze" where we have been learning about capacity, making pens and seeing how many animals can fit in each one. We have been filling different sized containers with oat bran and trying to estimate how many spoonfuls we can fit in each one. The Wiltshire Lieutenancy

Wanborough is lucky to have the Lord-Lieutenant of Wiltshire, Sarah Troughton, as one of its residents. Here are her thoughts on the history of the Lieutenancy and what life holds for one of Her Majesty the Queen's Lord Lieutenants today.

"My main job is to be HM The Queen's representative in the county and "to uphold the dignity of the Crown". Old fashioned words possibly but ones I proudly attempt to adopt. L-Ls (Lord-Lieutenants), in every county in the UK are appointed by HM on the recommendation of the Prime Minister. Before that, a consultative process is undertaken by an officer from the Cabinet Office who takes soundings from organisations around the county - the church, voluntary organisations, businesses - as to who might suit the post. I was shortlisted with others, perhaps because I

have been involved in the voluntary sector with Youth Action Wiltshire and The Community Foundation for many years or perhaps because I am a woman! I was interviewed and a week later a letter arrived from the then Prime Minister David Cameron inviting me to accept the position. I talked it over with my husband Peter, accepted, and I retire when I am 75. The role is unpaid.

Lord-Lieutenants were created in Tudor times by Henry VIII. There was no regular Army at the time, so in times of threat and invasion the monarch asked local noblemen, later called Lieutenants, to assemble defensive forces and militia to quell frequent local rebellions and restore order. These Lieutenants were more than often Lords themselves and the term Lord-Lieutenant grew from there.

The Militia Act of 1661 made the office of Lieutenant permanent and gave it full power over the militia, and particularly in time of political uncertainty the L-L became key in the county. The role evolved over the centuries from one of keeping law and order in the counties, certainly before there was a police force, to be the sovereign's representative.

Before County Councils were established in 1889, local government services were administered in the counties by magistrates who were led by the Lieutenants. They held the title Custos Rotulorum or Keeper of the Rolls, (which I hold today, but I am not a JP.) As Chief Justice of the Peace and the controller of the militia, the Lord-Lieutenant was central to the maintenance of order.

However, in 1871 the militia ceased to be under the command of the Lord-Lieutenant and in 1921 the L-L duties under the Militia Act came to an end. You will be pleased to hear today's L-L s have no power, but, in Wiltshire certainly, the military connection is still strong.

I have an office in County Hall in Trowbridge and am L-L of the historic county of Wiltshire which of course is governed by two Councils, Swindon and Wiltshire, and we all work closely together.

My duties are intermittent - some weeks I have 3 or 4 engagements, some weeks none, but average about 120 per annum. They vary hugely - one week I am with the Wiltshire Scouts, the next we have a Royal visit, the next a Police Awards Ceremony, the one after an evening with the Royal Artillery at Larkhill, and that is why I enjoy the job so much. I am President or Patron of a good mix of charities such as Wiltshire Churches Trust, the Multiple Sclerosis Centre in Warminster, RFCA [Reserve Forces and Cadets Assoc.], ABF The Soldiers' Charity, St. John's Ambulance, Friends of Salisbury Cathedral, Prospect Hospice to name a few.

My office organises a number of Royal visits each year - we had 12 in 2018. They are time-consuming and require unbelievably detailed planning, but I believe that they are appreciated and worthwhile! Wiltshire and Swindon this last year had visits from HRH The Duchess of Cornwall, including a visit to Arkell's Swindon Brewery and with HRH The Prince of Wales a wonderful and important visit to Salisbury after the Novichok poisonings. There were also visits from The Princess Royal, The Earl and Countess of Wessex and The Duchess of Gloucester, and there are more planned for 2019.

I am delighted to host a ceremony for those awarded the British Empire medal each year. We have held them at Bowood, Wiltshire Council, Great Chalfield and this year in Salisbury Cathedral.

I have a badge of office - a pretty red and white enamel and pearl Tudor Rose hanging on a bow. The gentlemen L-Ls have a military uniform with a sword and spurs. There is continual discussion as to whether Lady L-Ls should have a uniform. The first lady L-L to be chosen was the Duchess of Norfolk (a good Tudor name) in the 1960s, and there is now a healthy balance of ladies and gentlemen. I am the first Lady Lord-Lieutenant in Wiltshire, but not the first in the country.

I have 4 or 5 young people picked from the 3 Cadet Forces, assigned to me as L-L Cadets each year. They accompany me on lots of trips and are always present at Royal visits. They appear in full uniform, outsmart us all and are a credit to young people today. They would carry the male L-L's sword, in churches for example, but I do not ask them to carry my handbag! They often ask me what they should do on an engagement. I suggest that they should salute anyone and everyone at every opportunity, and if possible, find me a cup of tea.

I work with the High Sheriff - an even older title than the Lieutenancy, from the 1200s, which is an annual post and whose main duty is to care for the Judiciary. The High Sheriff of each county also tends to choose a cause to concentrate on. This year for example, the High Sheriff Mrs Nicky Alberry has chosen "Domestic Abuse" and next year's High Sheriff, Mr David Scott's cause will be "Youth".

I have a Vice Lord- Lieutenant and a number of Deputy Lieutenants to help me, to whom I am most grateful, and they often represent me and the Lieutenancy at Mayoral events and Citizenship Ceremonies, laying wreaths on Remembrance Sunday and other occasions.

There is a Lieutenancy website with Wiltshire Council, and we have a Lieutenancy Twitter page (@WiltsLieutenant)!

I thoroughly enjoy my post and am honoured indeed to be the Lord-Lieutenant of this wonderful county of ours."

Wanborough has Hedgehogs!



Through the work I am doing to gather data for the Storyboard project, there has been plenty of interest in the local wildlife population. Some of our residents have come forward to let me know they are sharing their gardens with Hedgehogs, and as the weather has been warm through February some of these prickly little creatures have come out of hibernation early.

Of the four residents I know of, who share their gardens with Hedgehogs, one told me about their emergency rescue last year of

four baby hoglets. Sue Owen, of Magdalen Road, told me that one Sunday night she noticed an adult hedgehog had been killed just outside their house. Four days later she came home from work and spotted 2 tennis ball sized hoglets walking across the garden. They were out in the day, so she knew they were in trouble. As she was picking them up, 2 more came strolling across the lawn. Sue knew that an adult had been living with them but had no idea that babies were under the shed too. It was mum that had died.

Vets have a duty of care for wildlife and most of them will treat wild animals for nothing. The hoglets were taken to a vet and, once assessed, they were transferred to Oak & Furrows Wildlife Rescue Centre in Cricklade. It was touch and go as to whether they would survive, they weighed less than 100grams and had to reach a healthy 300grams. Fortunately, all four recovered and were able to be released back into the Owen's garden, three females and one male, who quickly left home to find new unrelated female friends.

The females remained, so as Hedgehogs aren't territorial, they were likely to winter together. They stopped taking the food in late October/early November. Sue put fresh dry hay near the shed and it disappeared, hopefully they used it to build a cosy nest. Since going into hibernation, the girls haven't been seen, it's now just a waiting game to see if they have survived the winter. Let's hope they all emerge healthy and well!

LIDDINGTON VILLAGE HALL IS 25!

Part 3

Those who have read my previous articles will (I hope) recall that the Hall committee had decided to "take a leap of faith" and start a project to replace the old building by a brand new construction. The calendar year 1991 was taken up with, firstly intensive fundraising, and secondly, negotiations with Swindon (then Thamesdown) planning department.

Our architect, Geoff Drew, took the project to his heart, and came up with regular improvements and helpful suggestions. His original plans showed just a main room with a small kitchen; his final scheme included a much more spacious kitchen, disabled WC, and an additional meeting room on the first floor. Geoff applied for planning consent, and began many months of negotiations with



the Borough. The Conservation Officer was much involved, unsurprisingly in view of the sensitive site near Grade 1 listed All Saints' Church and other traditional properties. Planning consent for demolition of the old Hall and its replacement was granted in November 1992.

Meanwhile fundraising activities continued with enormous enthusiasm. Who can remember filling Smartie tubes with 20p pieces? Who could forget Barn Dances with the late John Cole leading his Southern Syncopators? Then there was the 60s Disco, the Golf Day, and, amazingly, the Coffee morning raising £830! Equally importantly, donations large and small came rolling in, and grants received from various bodies. The amount required crept up over the £100k mark.

In January 1993 the committee appointed Leslie Parsons, a semi-retired quantity surveyor, then living at Hinton Parva, to supervise the building contract. Again we were very fortunate in our professional guidance. With encouragement of the Borough planners, we agreed to incorporate various features of the old building into its successor; hence the new Hall has a very traditional appearance. Leslie sent out tender documents to six local builders. The writer remembers clearly the meeting when the tenders were opened, and the relief when we realised that the lowest tender sum was affordable. So the contract was awarded to E. W. Beard Limited of Swindon, appropriately in view of the Beard family having a long association with Liddington. Work started in April 1993, with completion anticipated for the end of that year.

The writer had stepped down from the committee chairmanship after four years, and we were glad that David Bunce agreed to take over the lead role during the planning and building period. David was stepping back from his business responsibilities, and was able to devote an incredible amount of his time to the Hall project. He was on hand to greet the 11th Duke of Marlborough ("Sunny") when he arrived on 1 March 1994 to perform the opening ceremony. (As previously explained, by a legal "quirk" the Duke's trustees were and are the freeholders of the land.)

During the 25 years since then the Hall has hosted an enormous variety of events, functions and meetings, and has grown to be well loved by our community. Improvements to the Hall have been made steadily under the auspices of the committee with background support from the Parish Council. Sadly, many of the key figures are no longer with us, and we think especially of the late Robin Skillen, Geoff Drew, Leslie Parsons, David Bunce, and Basil Archerthe last mentioned at various times having chaired both the Hall committee and the Parish Council.


