Dobbín Day Service

An annual Church Service that is usually held in February each year but unfortunately has had to be cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The only other known reason for the service having to be cancelled in previous years is during wartime.

Dobbin Day is a very special annual service, the longest running tradition and unique to the village of Wanborough. The service celebrates the life of 18th Century rich land owner William Stanley, owner of Warneage Manor, which used to stand in Upper Wanborough. Mr Stanley left £50 in his will, a huge sum when he died in 1745, requesting that this be used to distribute bread to the poor in the Parish at a service at Wanborough Church near to the date of his death in

February each year.





News from the Bell Towers

Despite churches remaining open for public worship during the latest lockdown, the bells of Wanborough and Liddington have fallen silent again. The areas that we ring from are not large enough to observe good social distancing in these difficult times, and the ringers are doing as advised and "Staying at Home".

There were only two services in church over Christmas, both at Wanborough, on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Social and Christmas bubbles allowed 3 bells to be rung on Christmas Eve and 4 bells on Christmas Day. On New Years Eve only token bells were rung before midnight following which the 12 bongs of midnight were chimed. This is not the way ringers usually celebrate at this time of the year, but it was the best we were permitted to do.

Sadly, due to coronavirus, public performances of any kind were not permitted, and all of this year's handbell activities were cancelled. There were no practices, no "Ringing round the Wards" at GWH and Prospect, no "Ringing round the Pubs", no church services, and for the first time in over 30 years, we were unable to collect for our nominated charity.

Wanborough & Ramsbury Doctor's Surgery - Update

The last few weeks have been very busy at the Surgery. As you are aware we were stood up as an approved Covid vaccination site mid December and started with our first clinic on 18th December at Ramsbury Surgery. You will have seen in the media there have been many changes since the vaccination programme started and we have had to make adjustments along the way. Of course, the changes to the second dose scheduling has caused great upset and unrest amongst many patients.

Vaccine deliveries are somewhat adhoc and very little notice is received. Please be reassured that all patients will be contacted as and when you become eligible to receive the vaccine. Please do not ring the Surgery as this is blocking our phone lines and at times preventing our receptionists from making outgoing calls to book in patients for their vaccinations.

We are promised that the vaccine deliveries will improve over the next couple of weeks so hopefully we can then push ahead with the vaccination programme. Please continue to follow all government guidance and stay safe.

If you become aware of any patient struggling to collect their medication during this period of lockdown, please let us know we will always find a way to get medication to a patient.

<u>Latest Services update – as at 16th January 2021</u>

We confirm that with the current covid-19 regulations the position with the facilities and services is as follows:-

Play Areas – Open: The Handyman will continue to carry out weekly checks on both play areas but we cannot clean all equipment on a regular basis. It is therefore important that all users use hand sanitiser before and after using the play

equipment. If the play area is busy please come back at a different time.

Public Open Spaces – Open for everyone to enjoy and take their daily exercise.

Litter bins – Our contractor will continue to empty all village bins on a weekly basis, we would appreciate if the bin is full that you please take your litter home.

Allotments – Open: You can go to the allotments as your daily exercise, but please ensure you keep your distance from other allotment holders.

Hooper's Field Pavilion, Car Park, Tennis Courts and Football Pitches – All closed: Local residents can still use the open space for their daily exercise.

BT Telephone Box - Church Road

BT have now officially transferred the BT telephone box on Church Road to Parish Council, which is good news. A poster is now displayed in the box confirming this.

BT have provided us with comprehensive guidelines on how the telephone box should be maintained, including providing details on the exact paint to be used to ensure that the colour remains the same.



The telephone box is a listed building so the exterior cannot be changed in any way, but we are now allowed to alter things internally and can use the box to the benefit of the community.

As a result of the article last month we have had some volunteers come forward, as well as someone with another suggestion for

what the box could be used for. Village Maintenance

The Village Handyman continues to work throughout the lockdown and is doing a great job carrying out the weekly checks of the play areas so that they can remain open during the latest lockdown. He is also

carrying out regular litter picks, clearing footpaths and general maintenance around the village. If you see him out and about please say hello from a distance.

Parish Council recently went out to tender for the Village Grounds Maintenance Contract and Hooper's Field Grounds Maintenance Contract. We confirm that Idverde were appointed as our new contractors at our meeting in December. Idverde are a well-established grounds maintenance and landscaping company who have recently set up a branch in Swindon. They carry out grounds maintenance for many Wiltshire Parish Councils and also North Swindon Parish Council and have come highly recommended to us. We look forward to working with Idverde from April this year.



Parish Council have recently asked a local Arboriculturist, Certhia Consulting, to carry out "Tree Survey" of the condition of all the trees on land owned by the Parish or land that the Parish Council are now responsible for. As part of Parish Council's insurance this survey is carried out every three years.

The tree survey identifies the condition of all trees, the work required to maintain them and the priority of the work required. This survey provides information that can then be used to ensure all trees are maintained safely within areas that the Parish Council are responsible for.

Parish Council are currently looking at the work that is recommended to be completed within 3 months; you may see our tree surgeon carrying out this work over the next few months prior to the spring.

We carry out our own checks around the village to identify any maintenance that needs doing. However if there is anything that you feel needs urgent attention around the village, then please report any maintenance issues to the Parish Clerk by either e-mail clerk@wanborough.info, by using the "Maintenance Report" on the Parish website www.wanborough.info, or alternatively text, ring or WhatsApp on telephone number 07588 769829. Please do not use Facebook to report maintenance issues as the Parish Clerk cannot keep track of these.

Dog Fouling problems

This perennial issue has been raised again by members of the public, in relation to the appalling state of the open spaces particularly at Church Meadow around the play area, Hooper's Field, Woodland Trust and Lower Rec as a result of people exercising dogs.

If you are exercising a dog, it is not acceptable to just ignore what it has left on the grass or path. You would not like to step in it, so why leave it for others to do so? Please try and remember to take a bag with you on your walk, pick it up, bag it and bin it. If for some reason you do not have a bag to collect and remove it, would you at least please kick (or flick, using a stick) the offending material into the undergrowth, so it is out of the area used by children and adults.

The practice of putting it in a bag and then hanging it on the nearest tree or gatepost is also unacceptable, as the waste cannot then naturally rot and the festoon of bags is unsightly.

There is no "them" to clear it up afterwards, so please take it home and put it in the waste bin. If the problems continue, it may be necessary to ask the Borough Council dog wardens to patrol the area.

Hooper's Field Draft Plans Consultation

Many thanks to everyone who submitted their feedback on the Hooper's Field expansion draft plans. We hope everyone had the opportunity to view the plans either by visiting the display on the external wall of the pavilion at Hooper's Field or by viewing them online. If you still haven't managed to see them, they remain available online if you still want to look.

A summary of all the feedback we received will be available to view on the Parish website (www.wanborough.info) from the beginning of February.

We are currently working with the Architect to finalise the plans, with some slight amendments as a result of the feedback received. The final plans are due to be discussed at the Parish Council meeting on 25th January and, if approved, will mean we can submit a planning application to Swindon Borough Council soon afterwards.

As you can imagine the process to get to the planning application stage has been a long process and has taken several years including:-

- Carrying out a feasibility study;
- Carrying out consultations with residents including two questionnaires;
- Consulting with all user groups and sports clubs;
- Liaising with external bodies including Swindon Borough Council, sporting associations, etc;
- Visiting similar facilities to gain their feedback and experiences.

There is still a considerable amount of work to be done, but hopefully you will soon all see the benefit that this proposal will bring to the village.

Village Litter Picks

Many thanks to all volunteers who gave up an hour of their time to pick up litter around the village on Saturday 2^{nd} January. People collected rubbish separately in different areas of the villages, to ensure adequate social distancing.

The litter pick was carried out in conjunction and to support "Keep Swindon Tidy" campaign (http://plasticfreeswindon.org/activi.../keepswindontidy/day/). Mostly bottles and cans were collected, but there were also a number of discarded masks around the bus stop on Rotten Row (Kite Hill end).

Unfortunately we are unable to carry out any further community litter picks until after the end of the current lockdown. We will let you know when this is possible, hopefully early in the Spring before the undergrowth starts growing again

Finance

Precept 2021/22

Parish Council are currently working on the budget proposal for 2021/22; they had a finance committee meeting on 11th January to carry out some initial discussions, including reviewing the current year budget and spend. We are due to make a final decision on the Precept for 2021/22 at our meeting on 25th January and we will confirm details in next month's Lyden.

Grants

Did you know that every year Parish Council allocate a budget for grants to local clubs, organisations and charities to help support them? In the 2019/20 financial year Parish Council gave:

£600 to Wanborough Village Hall towards the maintenance of the building;

£950 to St Andrew's Church towards the churchyard maintenance;

£260 to Ridgeway Link, however this charity has unfortunately now closed, so some of this grant has been returned.

£100 to St Andrew's Church flower club;

£632 to football clubs to purchase new goal posts for Hooper's Field;

£120 to a local resident who was making face coverings during the pandemic;

£300 to Wanborough Primary School for the George Gibbs' prizes.

If there are any local clubs, organisation and charities who would like to apply for a grant from the Parish Council then this can be done from April 2021 (the next financial year) by contacting the Parish Clerk, details shown below.

Church Road – Highways improvements

The second formal consultation for the highways improvements at Church Road is now complete. SBC Highways Officer has confirmed that they received two objections and one letter of support. The objections received were mainly in relation to the double yellow lines along the lane up to St Andrew's Church. Parish Council have confirmed that they fully support the scheme, which they proposed a while ago, and hope that now the consultation is complete this will soon be implemented with the support from Swindon Borough Council.

Next meeting

Parish Council continue to hold all meetings virtually via Zoom. Residents are welcome to join, submit questions and listen to meetings. Ward Councillor Update from Gary Sumner

My next Ward Surgery at 10am 30th January will be via Zoom (you'll need the Zoom app on your phone or tablet).

Open the Zoom app and enter the following: Meeting ID: 961 4274 0633 - Passcode: 072719

Gigabit Fibre: We have (at the time of writing) reached 83% of required pledges. I am hoping to organise a Zoom meeting with a fibre provider who will be able to provide more details on the likely monthly costs and commitments. My website is regularly updated and if a meeting can be arranged, I will add the information there.

Redlands & Wanborough Road: I have raised safety concerns with the proposed junction to Redlands and as part of that I had suggested to Officers that a 30mph limit on the Wanborough Road is more appropriate. They agreed and said that this is something they would support. Wanborough Rd will have new junctions with Lotmead & Redlands and will be cut in two by the Southern Connector Road. A pavement will be constructed and the road narrowed, so a 30mph limit will be the best outcome. Construction starts soon.

Nearby Highways Schemes: You will no doubt experience some inconvenience as you travel beyond the village this year. There are nearly £90m of Highways upgrades being carried out in East Swindon now, including Junction 15, White Hart, Gablecross, Oxford Rd (Nythe Rd) and Piccadilly (Covingham) as well as the Southern Connector Rd described below. This is because we have been incredibly successful at gaining Government funding and much must be spent within specified dates. At all times there will be suitable diversions posted, but on a positive note we will have a vastly improved road network, many years ahead of the homes being planned.

Southern Connector Road: This £30m bypass goes from Commonhead to the New Eastern Villages (NEV) and crosses the road between Poplars and Redlands. It has been designed so that the residents in the NEV cannot turn into Wanborough Road from the East. It includes cycle paths and 3.5km of new hedgerows and tree planting. Construction starts early 2021.

Village Roads: I've continued to get highways to sweep roads of leaves & clean pavements where moss has made them slippery. Please let me know of any problems you spot.

Wanborough Traffic Calming: I was pleased to be able to sign off the £340,000 funding for the first Phase of this important scheme (subject to full council approving the budget) which is included in the Capital Programme budget for 2021/2022.

PRECEPT FOR 2021/22

At the January meeting it was unanimously agreed that the Precept would need to be increased by 5 % for 2021/22 to maintain the level of service that has been achieved since the transfer of services from Swindon Borough Council in 2017. Our aim has been to carry out works and maintenance where it is most needed and we hope you have seen an improvement. This increase will mean that the annual precept for a Band D property will be £64.37, a rise of £3.07 per annum. The Parish Council will continue to make every effort to ensure that the precept is no higher than is necessary and remains prudent and self-sustaining.

ANGUS MACPHERSON, Police & Crime Commissioner

Angus Macpherson joined the Parish Council meeting on January 6th via Zoom as part of the obligation to communicate with as many community groups as possible during the current consultation into the Police Precept for 2021/22. He explained that Constabularies across the country had received a settlement of £636m from the Government. However, included in the calculation was the assumption that a further £15 per annum per Band D property would be achieved by an increase to the Police Precept. He wanted to recruit a further 49 Police Officers and retain the current 132 PCSOs across the County. To achieve this an increase in the current Police Precept was needed.

SPEED SIGN

A speed enforcement operation had taken place on 31st December 2020/1st January 2021 with speed checks on specific roads around Swindon. The Police had chosen to target Purley Road due to the evidence provided by the data from the speed sign that the Parish Council had shared with them. The Police have since informed the Parish Council that a number of drivers were spoken to with some receiving fixed penalty notices for travelling at excess speed. The Parish Council will continue to keep the Police informed by regularly sharing the data captured by the device.

Stay local for fast track Covid Testing

With the introduction of need for a negative Covid test result within 72 hours for any of us lucky enough to be able to leave the country, I am mindful that I don't know how to access a fast-track covid test. When out doing our daily permitted exercise recently we choose to walk to Liddington and back. Luckily, we didn't need a test to cross the Lydenbrook and wander round Liddington. However, we did happen to pass a sign on Ham Road that piqued our interest though, Racoo Screening! In my world of clay, it would have been spelt Raku and involved a kiln, so on the return journey I decided to investigate and found two people in a gazebo looking very cold.

It turn's out that we have our very own Covid rapid antigen testing centre. I have checked out their website and found the following:

Racoo provide a rapid antigen test service at their Swindon 'drive in' facility. A 'sample collection & consent' form is completed with you which details name, DOB, date, time, passport number and results. This information is also emailed to you on a personal document which can be printed. They claim:

- Results in 10-15 minutes
- CE marked test device
- Sensitivity of 93.7%*
- Specificity of 98.8%*

Cost of the service at £60

* From manufacturer documentation

History of Wanborough Wanborough Village Pound

In pre-Enclosure times Wanborough and many other villages had a village pound, where stray animals were impounded until their owners paid a fee to have them released. In 1672 one Abraham Brind was brought before the manor court for 'a pound breach', that is unauthorised removal of his animals. He was fined 20s, a considerable sum in those days. Wanborough's pound, or 'communem parcum de Wanborough' as it is described

in Latin in the manor rolls, occupied an area of what is now the Lower Recreation Ground. Part of the sarsen stone wall which surrounded the pound still survives alongside Chapel Lane. A few years ago the Parish Council cleared the undergrowth from around the wall so it could be seen.

Praeter House, which stood on the corner of High Street and Chapel Lane, was the site of the local butchers together with slaughter house, it backed

onto the village pound. Conveniently situated to deal with those stray animals unclaimed by their owners.



VE Day 75th Anniversary Display Project


Between 1941 and 1946 the RAF used the fields on Wanborough Plain as an airfield, initially by Flying Training Schools for day and night landing practice and later to train glider pilots.

This extract of a plan drawn in January 1945 for the Air Ministry shows The Croft in the top left and King Edward's Place (now PGL) at the bottom right corners. Although the original plan is now in poor condition it is just possible to make out two runways, one approached from the west over Liddington and the other from the south directly over Hill Farm. The surface of the fields needed a lot of preparation; The Hollow was closed and hedges removed, which is probably the reason for the absence of any large or ancient trees at the top of The Hollow and along Ermin Way.

The airfield reverted to agriculture when the RAF departed and some of the buildings, like the four hangers circled on the plan, were used for storing farm equipment. Over time the ravages of rust meant many of the metal structures, including the hangers and the fuel storage tanks, were removed and now there is no visible trace of the airfield and its buildings, although the concrete bases of the barrack blocks and armoury in the west corner may have been used as the base of the present stable yard.

Today, as you walk up The Hollow and reach the open fields, only the ghost of RAF Wanborough remains. Please get in touch if you have any photographs or stories to tell about the RAF airfield in Wanborough.




It has come to my notice that a considerable number of new houses have appeared in Green Lane. As far as I am aware, there has been no public consultation, no planning application nor permission for these.
