

#### Wanborough Parish Council

We have recently received a letter of resignation from Mike Webster. Mike joined the Parish Council in October 2020, he was Vice Chair supporting Bob Biggs from May 21 to Jan 22, most recently he was the Chair of the Footpaths & Village Maintenance Committee. Mike was heavily involved in gaining funding from Wiltshire Wildlife Trust to restore the pond at Hooper's Field. We thank him for his work as a Parish Councillor and wish him all the best in his new home.

The casual vacancy has now been advertised. Once the deadline has passed we will know if there is to be a "By-Election" or whether the Parish Council is able to co-opt.

#### **Village Maintenance**

A Footpaths & Village Maintenance Committee meeting was held on 1st August. At this meeting it was agreed to approve a quote to repair the sculpture at the top of Rodway open space. The repair work will include cutting out, removing and replacing the rotten wood, tightening and replacing some of the bolts, plus carrying out further repairs to the seat. The sculpture will remain fenced off until the work is carried out and we hope this will be completed by the end of September.

At the Lower Recreation Field play area the small springer has had to be removed as the base is broken. We are currently waiting for some spare parts from Wicksteed, once these are received the small springer will be re-installed.

You may not be aware that the footpath known locally as "Kings Lane" (which is the narrow concrete path that goes from Mayfield, near the corner on Church Road, to Kite Hill) isn't registered as a footpath on the definitive footpath map for the whole length. As you will see from the map, Kings Lane (footpath 9) from Mayfield goes down the hill (green dashed line) and as it reaches the bottom it then continues past Kings Lane Farm and not towards Kite Hill.


At the moment this isn't a problem for residents as the access to the path from Kite Hill is open and regularly used. However there may be a point in the future when things change and the access could be closed.

Parish Council would therefore like to submit an application to register this section of footpath, from Kite Hill to footpath 9, on the definitive map to ensure "Kings Lane" remains open from Kite Hill.

#### We need your help

As part of the application process we need to submit evidence confirming that residents have used this section of the footpath for at least 20 years. If you are a regular user of Kings Lane and would be willing to write a statement confirming this, please contact the Parish Clerk clerk@wanborough.info who can provide you with a form to complete, which shouldn't take long to complete. We look forward to hearing from you.

#### Village Autumn Clean up

#### **High Street - Planters & bulb planting**

Parish Council were approached by a local resident to ask if they would consider installing planters along the High Street and plant spring bulbs to help make the area look prettier and to soften the impact of the traffic calming scheme.

Since the initial request a number of residents have offered to help and have been discussing their ideas with each other.

A proposal was due to be put to the Parish Council at their meeting in August, which will then need to be submitted to SBC Highways as they will need to approve the location of the planters.

Many thanks to everyone who has offered their help, we will be looking for volunteers to help plant the spring bulbs in the autumn and will confirm details next month.

#### **Planning**

#### **Lotmead Development Site - Discharge of Conditions**

Now that the Lotmead development site within the New Eastern Villages has gained "Outline" planning consent for 2,700 new dwellings, the applicant is now in the process of submitting their "discharge of conditions" planning applications where they provide more detail in relation to the design and landscaping scheme.

Phase 1 with access off Wanborough Road was originally planned for 200 new dwellings, however this number has now increased to 287. Parish Council objected to this increase but the applicant has stated that as per the "viability" analysis submitted and approved by SBC the target figure for phase 1 is now 287.

The applicant, Countryside and Sovereign Housing Association, has confirmed that they will be holding a "drop in" session at Wanborough Village Hall near the end of September to allow residents to view their plans for the site, especially Phase 1. Further details to follow on this.

#### **Southern Connector Road**

There are two large "discharge of conditions" planning applications for the final two phases of work on the Southern Connector Road still out on consultation and awaiting approval (Planning applications S/COND/22/0346 and S/COND/22/0296). Parish Council strongly objected to the proposed street lighting scheme at Pack Hill and we are currently waiting to receive revised plans which SBC have confirmed they are currently working on. Once we have more information on this we will let you know.

#### Wanborough Road

We were disappointed to hear that the Wanborough Road closure has been extended to at least early November 2022. Parish Council have requested a meeting with SBC Highways to discuss Wanborough Road and the proposed scheme of work. We hope to have a date agreed soon and we will provide an update on this as soon as we know.

Please support our local businesses during this difficult time and spread the word that they are open despite the road closures.

#### Chairman's 2022 Annual Report (Part 3 continued from last month)

#### Joel Joffe Memorial.

Lady Joffe came down from Bristol in the summer to unveil the Memorial to Joel Joffe. This Memorial was beautifully designed and executed by Ruth Moore. Around sixty people attended the unveiling and listened to Vanetta's moving words. The Memorial is a reminder of the wide scope of Joel's contributions and no small insight into important aspects of history. Thank you to all who helped make the event so celebratory, especially our CinC, Ruth.

#### Footpaths.

The second strand to remembering Joel was to name the existing public footpath, that runs from the intersection of The Street and the lane to the Manor alongside the stream to Bell Lane, Joel Joffe Way. New sign posting was required as the one at The

Street end had mysteriously disappeared. It is, of course, the responsibility of the Parish Council to mark clearly the beginning and end of public Rights of Way, so that there can be no misunderstanding as to where we may walk or indeed run .Consequently, the Houdini sign has been replaced ,on public land, with one of the two Joel Joffe Way Signs (the other being by Bell Lane).

#### Liddington Hill Trees.

I wrote a short piece in The Lyden a few months ago about the danger of ill-considered and over use of this area becoming a threat to the beauty that draws people there in the first place. We are presently applying for a grant to assist making some improvements to repair the damage and encourage more sensitive usage. Thank you to those who responded by offering to help clear up the mess. We have been advised to pause this until the grant is secured.

#### Hillfort Millennial Viewing Platform.

Due to collapse this is fenced off and needs extensive repair. We are applying for a grant to help fund this.

#### Communications.

There are a number of ways in which The Parish Council tries to keep you in the picture. Minutes and Agendas of the monthly meetings are posted on the noticeboard against the Old Post Office wall and on the website. Additional information from meetings appears in The Lyden Magazine, on the noticeboard and on the website. The Parish Council encourages you to use the website and indeed contribute to it yourselves. Thank you, Cllr Sarah Hill, for all the work you have put in to making it a really useful source of news about Liddington and its Parish Council. We try to notify the Liddington Support Group's chat forum and the website of any important items that arise between meetings. Do not forget there is a slot at every meeting for contributions from residents. And of course, the Parish Clerk can be contacted if you have any concerns or inspirational ideas. Laura Evans has been Clerk for a year now. My thanks to her for all her hard work. She is always cheerful and makes light of the tasks we pass her way.

#### Your Borough Councillor update - Gary Sumner:

#### Wanborough Road Closure:

Unfortunately, the timescale for this has been extended to at least November and although the scheme is being carried out by Conlon on behalf of the developers for the Redlands Grove development, SBC have agreed to undertake some Comms on behalf of them. Conlon have provided direct assistance to the Wanborough Show this year to facilitate access for the Steam Engines and large vehicles.

The New Eastern Villages development is full of interesting historical remains which each area of excavation having to be overseen by the archaeologists employed by both the developers and the Southern Connector Road construction project - and these in turn are overseen by the County Archaeologist - such is the significance of the findings being uncovered. Sarsen stones have been uncovered

just below the tarmac on the Wanborough Road, reinforcing the Roman history of this historic route.

Conlon also discovered an uncharted pipe on the new junction with Redlands Grove and this has meant that the new junction has been built up by 0.7m above current levels. I have liaised with affected residents at Foxbridge to ensure the required profiling is done to their access.



The installation of new highway drainage, street lights and footpath construction is required on Wanborough Road as part of the new Redlands Grove housing development for the New Eastern Villages.

Conlon and other contractors have a legal right to do this work and we appreciate residents are facing disruption as it happens.

We'd like to remind people that businesses in the area are still open, and a signed diversion is in place.'

#### **Lotmead Development:**

This development is coming forward with the 'Reserved Matters' (the detail of the development and layout) and archaeology continuing on site which has found evidence of an enclosure system and that the area was previously forested. There are Iron Age remains and evidence of a farmstead.

I have recently met with the developers of the Lotmead development (for 2,500 homes) and they will be organising a 'drop in' event in the village to explain the development, what we are likely to see and how the village may be affected. The first phase of some 217 homes will be the only part to connect to the Wanborough Road and all of the remainder will connect to the Southern Connector Road (SCR).

A reminder that there are very strict controls on the SCR junction with Wanborough Road so those thousands of residents will not have access to the Wanborough Road. The partnership between Countryside Homes and Sovereign will deliver many more affordable homes on a range of tenures and this may well be of interest to young local families priced out of the housing market.

The wider development at Lotmead will deliver primary schools, significant areas of ecology (which will have public access) and extensive sports facilities which I imagine will be of significant interest to local clubs such as football - with a good number of all weather pitches. The development will be accessible to the village by the new footpath being created on the Wanborough Road.

I also anticipate that the new Redlands Grove development as well as Lotmead will offer local Wanborough businesses such as our pubs access to a much wider number of customers.

#### Gigabit Fibre

Homes continue to be connected, with some in Wanborough on the first phase of the scheme planned for September commissioning, whilst the Phase 2 (Medbourne Lane and Church Road in Liddington) and Badbury to be commissioned in September/October.

Some of the delays are down to road closures which aren't always easy to agree under the current diversions.

I am reassured that by end of October most of the eligible premises will be ready to connect and the Gigabit vouchers have been extended accordingly.

#### **Neighbourhood Watch**

I was saddened to hear of a car theft in upper Wanborough in the middle of August. This being off the back of having reported a break in at the pumping station a few days earlier and the loss of the church roof in February.

The attending police officer told me Wanborough has a very low crime rate, she rarely has to come out to us, to me it doesn't feel like it at the moment. The sadness I feel is not only caused by the actions of a third party but also because no-one in our community ever sees anything.

The Pumping station is subject to break ins on a regular basis and they usually happen at night, this is the third I have reported. The church roof was also removed at night and the neighbours were too distant to hear anything. However, the car was stolen in the middle of the day at a weekend. Has our low crime rate made us complacent or are we so unfamiliar with our neighbours that we no longer recognise a stranger in our midst?



Wiltshire police have just launched Operation Siege, a crime prevention initiative to help prevent burglary and deter opportunistic thieves operating in Wiltshire and Swindon. The focus at the moment is on marking your property and recording your assets. If you are interested in accessing an advanced forensic marking product to help you protect your valuables. Wiltshire Police has agreed a special low rate for those living in Wiltshire and Swindon and you can buy a discounted home kit directly from the manufacturer using this link only: www.selectadna.co.uk/ nhw. However, these are not the kinds of items we appear to be losing. In our community the focus perhaps should be on getting to know our residents, helping each other and keeping an eye on our village assets as well as our personal ones.

#### Festival time once again!

When you read this August will be over and autumn will be on its way. However, as I write we are in the throes of a heatwave and I am on a high having been able to return to Fairport Convention's Cropredy Folk Festival at last. The tickets have been in the drawer for more than two and a half years, it has been a long wait to see the line-up scheduled for 2020! Oh, what a joy to be back amongst the friends we have made over the 29 years we have been attending. Billed as "Fairport's Reunion" when we first attended, this festival is now truly a reunion for us. Whilst this could have become a sad time remembering those no longer with us, care was taken to celebrate having come though the Covid to enjoy good music, meet old friends and make some new ones.



We are used to being well and truly rained on for these few festival days so it was a challenge to rethink what would be needed for a heat wave. Never before has so little alcohol been consumed and so much water drunk, just as well given the average age of the attendees is well over 50! Umbrellas normally used for keeping us dry were instead used to generate some shade. The mosh pit, normally packed with dancers was one of the few places with a cool breeze and taps for drinking water. Debates in the signing queue centred on hot tips for getting ice and the best time to grab a cold shower.

As ever, the atmosphere was fantastic and we heard music from bands we have not come across before. A total mix of musical genres from prog to heavy rock, bluegrass to Celtic pipes, 80's disco to reggae. My finds of the festival being a band call Home Service and a very excited young musician named Maddie Morris. Our three days of music were over far too quickly. #### Wanborough St Andrews Church Roof Update

I am pleased to report that the temporary roof over the nave of the church is now fully fitted, and protecting the church interior from all that rain we usually get in August! It has a secondary purpose; it will also help the roof contractor keep dry - he will be able to work in all weathers. Four contractors have been invited to tender, and their responses will be considered by the architect and PCC at the end of August. Once selected, work on the roof should commence at the end of October.



The planning application for an alternative material to the original lead roof is now with Swindon Borough Council, and their planning notice has been put in place.

There was a small amount of lead salvaged from the roof, and very special thanks are extended to Lawson Group for offering up time to help recover the salvaged lead from the church and transport it to EMR Swindon, who were also very supportive to the church with the rate paid. Gifts like this really help to make a difference. Please do get in touch with the Church Officers if anyone has any skills or knowledge that can help us generate much needed funds.







**Lorna**. How long does it take you to write a book? Is it getting easier and quicker?

**Barry.** My first two books took approximately 8-9 months to write, proof read and publish. The new book took a year. I have a good excuse though, a springer spaniel puppy to walk several times a day.

**Lorna**. Where do you get your inspiration from?

Barry. I just have a vivid imagination. Definitely best suited in writing action-packed fiction books.

150 million years ago the Jurassic rock was laid down. 4,000 years ago the area was settled and Highworth was established in the 13th century.

In its time Highworth has had a Strike School, mystery tunnels dug under the town, been fortified for Charles 1st, held sheep markets, had the Riot Act read in the 1830's, boasted a strong link to Coleshill where spies were trained during the war and hosted the ABBA Fan Club!!

Our tour was punctuated by cries of 'planes' as they flew overhead on their way to the Fairford Air Show. We were lucky to have beautiful weather and such informative and friendly guides. This is a highly recommended tour and very well worth doing.

Our meeting last month examined the topic of "Climate Change – what can we do as individuals", and we were delighted that several members form Old Town and Shrivenham WI's, and several partners joined us for the evening. We were also pleased to welcome Elma Lawer, WI advisor from Wiltshire Federation.

Our monthly meeting in September will be on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> September, where we welcome Paul Williams to give us a talk on "Local Downland Village History". Doors open at 7pm for 7.30pm start at Hinton Parva Village Hall.

Our climate change theme last month included the results of the "Big Plastic Count" where over 107,000 households in the UK counted their single use plastic consumption in one week in May earlier this year. The total counted was around 6.5 million pieces in just one week across the UK - that's equivalent to a staggering 96.6 billion pieces a year across all UK households!

The most commonly counted items were fruit and veg packaging, followed by snack bags, packets and wrappers, which illustrates how difficult it is for shoppers to avoid packaging when purchasing these products. Of the 6.5m pieces counted that week only 12% was recyclable, with 25% going into landfill, 46% incinerated, and 17% exported (UK exports a staggering 1,800 tonnes of plastic waste every single day).

Clearly recycling doesn't begin to address the problem, and recyclability is not infinite. There is a limited number of times before quality is downgraded and then sent to landfill. Most recycled plastic isn't of enough quality to use for packaging anyway – its downcycled into crates, traffic cones, fences etc.

If we continue to use plastic packaging at our current rate there will always be the need for huge amounts of new plastic – no matter how much we recycle!

Tips for reducing limited use plastic;

- Remember to take cloth bags when you go shopping
- Buy more bulk food and fewer packaged products
- Refuse single use plastic
- Avoid cosmetics with micro plastics
- Wear natural fabrics
- Replace containers with glass or steel (can be infinitely recycled)
- Put your plastic waste in the correct recycling containers
- Choose to re-use, repurpose
- Lobby your supermarkets to reduce their use of plastic packaging
- Check out *Highworth Recycling & Sustainability* ideas (facebook group) for a list of packaging/items that are accepted by "Visit Highworth" in Highworth High Street, that aren't recycled by your local authority
- Write to your MP:-
  - Government needs to create single use plastic reduction targets eg "50% reduction by 2025". Voluntary reductions are not working.
  - To ban plastic waste exports (UK exports 1800 tonnes of plastic every single day).
  - To extend responsibility to reduce plastic use with producers

Next month we will look at "Our Individual Carbon Footprint", and how we can challenge ourselves to examine the things we have control over to reduce our carbon impact.

In the meantime, we look forward to seeing you on 8<sup>th</sup> September – guests welcome!




