3. Update on the planning application at Foxbridge Village

An update from Chris Marsh Pegasus Group) was noted (appendix a)

Discussion regarding the Southern Connector Road (SCR) took place. Everyone agreed the road needed completing as soon as possible although remedial works were needed first. Queries were raised how this could be speeded up, it was felt development should stop until the road was completed. A resident asked for it to be noted that they felt the damage to the village roads caused by the developments, which is SCR, should be repaired by developers.

Appendix a

Danescroft LLP are progressing an application for the approval of reserved matters pursuant to the grant of Outline planning permission for mixed-use development at Foxbridge North, Wanborough Road, Swindon, with an application to Swindon Borough Council anticipated within the coming weeks. As such, representatives are seeking to engage local interests in advance of submission through dialogue with the Parish Council, ward councillors and local residents, enabling questions and comments to be considered and responded to. Broadly, the proposals relate to 220no, homes, comprising a mix of apartments and houses, at a scale of up to three storeys, together with an element of convenience retail, formal and informal public open space, play facilities and all supporting infrastructure. The emerging proposals respond to the technical constraints of the site, including below ground archaeology, surface water drainage and noise from the A419 dual carriageway, through the site layout and specific infrastructure mitigation to ensure a high standard of development for both future occupiers and nearby residents. A subsequent full planning application is expected in relation to the area known as 'Phase 2', previously shown as the new primary school that has since been committed at nearby Redlands. Once both applications are formally submitted, the parish and members of the public will be formally consulted by Swindon Borough Council and will have the opportunity to comment on the respective proposals alongside review by statutory technical consultees.

Appendix b

Wanborough Tennis Club Report for the Wanborough Parish meeting 14 May 2025

WTC is a steadily growing club, with around 200 members. We have a full committee of 12 volunteers working towards making our club an inclusive community asset, enabling as many people as possible to benefit from the services we offer.

The club is stable. Membership and court usage has increased in 2024 /25. All teams in the summer and winter leagues have performed well and results overall improved and the number of members playing matches has grown. We have strong junior membership with some of our youngest talent competing at County and national level.

- Currently we offer
- A variety of affordable memberships from families to tots
- Group and individual coaching
- Coaching groups for adult doubles, intermediate & beginner sessions
- Cardio tennis
- Parent & Child coaching sessions
- LTA Youth Junior programme
- Junior local inter-club competitions
- School holiday junior tennis camps
- Walking tennis
- Pay and play sessions for non-members

As part of our strategic review, we have set an aspiration to grow our membership by 10% per annum over the next couple of years and balance the makeup of adult /junior members to a 50/50% split. As part of this we want to offer more coaching activities and potentially pickleball.

Financing Court Resurfacing and the proposed new Floodlights on courts 3 and 4 are our main focus for 2025-2026 and beyond. We are actively in the process of putting together fundraising applications and trying to establish security for the club.

Court resurfacing will be needed within the next 2 to 4 years. This will be expensive and the club will require financial support. Price quoted at £60,000 + VAT for all 4 courts. To be able to use all 4 courts in winter we would like to install floodlights on courts 3 and 4. This would cost £35,000 - £40,000 plus VAT.

In the past the Parish Council has funded 50% of costs for maintenance. We need to understand what the position is going forward to ensure sustainability of the club. We are also looking for local sponsorship and donations and would be keen to hear from anyone who might be able to offer help in any way.

Appendix c

Wanborough Toddlers is a friendly, volunteer-run stay-and-play group for children from 0-5, i.e. birth to starting school. We're at the village hall on Tuesdays, 9.30-11.30.

It's just £2.50 per child, which includes snack, and hot drinks for parents/ grandparents/ carers. We have all sorts of toys that encourage the children to play together and make local friends!

We have around 15 toddlers and babies attending most weeks, and around 30 in total who attend at least sometimes. Most are aged between 6 months and 3.5 years old, and it is lovely to see them getting to know each other, knowing that many will attend school together in future. We have recently welcomed quite a few new families who have heard about us from our Facebook posts on local pages, including a few from Redlands and Covingham.
