

New Eastern Villages – Planning applications

- Lotmead Public Inquiry starts 30th April 2024.
- Green Land (Land East of Wanborough Road) WPC commented on revised application in February.
- Land North of Redlands a revised Hybrid Application expected soon.
- Redlands WPC commented 2nd Phase in February and SBC currently working through conditions.
- Redlands Primary School
- Foxbridge South Outline planning application has been granted. Design Code expected soon.
- Foxbridge North The Planning Inspector allowed an appeal by the developers.
- **Southern Connector Road** Ongoing surveys and reports regarding drainage and other technical matters. No date given for SCR opening but could be many months.




Finance Report

- Easement for Gas Pipe, £2k
- Allotment Rents Received, £1.9k

Total Income £153,066




Expenditure – Financial Year to 31st March 2024

- Ongoing communication and education re dog fowling on Church Meadow and Hoopers Field
- One litter picking day with furthers planned
- Hoping to engage Duke of Edinburgh volunteers to assist with checking footpath routes
- Planning to offer public walks on longer rural walks



Hooper's Field Sports Facility Report

- · Wanborough Sports Clubs continue to thrive:-
 - Wanborough Tennis Club maintained its increased membership, and have new £13,800 LED floodlights, partly funded by the PC
 - Wanborough Junior Football Club have new goal posts, partly funded by the PC. The membership stands at over 200
 - Wanborough Cricket Club will play two teams this current season; it has 35 adult members and 20 junior members
 - Wanborough Bowls Club have had the high hedge cut to half its height; this club will now be responsible for maintaining the hedge as well as the grounds
- Parish Council maintain the HF facility and now have a 3-year grounds maintenance contract with All Build
- Park Yoga is to be part-funded by the PC for one more year
- Dogs on Leads Policy is working effectively
- The Driveway potholes require a permanent solution
- WiFi now available/cameras and doorbell installed

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Hooper's Field Driveway Project Report

Project Progress

- AllBuild contractors have performed two temporary fixes on the driveway
- Funding has been approved from the 2024 Parish budget as well as part funding from the clubs, for a permanent solution

Permanent solution

- Quotes received varying from £12,000 to £25,000
- These quotes have varying specifications
- A new specification has been sent out to tender
- More areas will need looking at in the future







Allotments Report



- ❖ Ron Kent Annual Best Kept Allotment and Best Kept New Allotment a success with many plots at a high standard.
- ❖ Wanborough Road a relief for Covingham tenants when road reopened.
- Waiting List currently 10 applications on waiting list. Applicants from NEV should apply for plots at the new developments.
- Security now a priority after the thefts and vandalism on 5th April.
